The Federal SOC identifies all occupations and crafts in which work is performed for pay or profit. The project team assigned SOC titles/codes to the crosswalk list by matching the former job classes to a Federal Standard Occupational Class using the traditional classification methodology. The process involved a review of job criteria, historical classification data and when necessary, consultation with agencies and a review of Employee Work Profiles (EWP).

The conversion to federal SOC codes will not affect an employee's role title, pay band or salary. The coding is important because it will improve our ability to review work force data at a more meaningful level of detail for purposes of compensation management, EEO, career development and ongoing operational activities. Also, several DHRM policies refer to SOC codes as a basis for decisions.

An instructional guide to help you prepare for the implementation and related DHRM forms are attached. Please provide any formal comments using these forms as soon as possible but no later than April 1, 2003. If you concur with the crosswalk recommendations no response is necessary.
